Summary

In its ongoing efforts to alleviate hunger in Iran, the Niiky Foundation delivered its second food basket program in Khuzestan province during the winter inter 2024. In this round of the program 300 essential food baskets have been distributed to families in need across four regions including Susangerd (ایذه), Izeh (کنعان), Chanan (کنعان), and Kooye Mandali (کوی مندلی).

In addition to the food baskets, 38 pairs of sports shoes and 30 sets of sports outfits were purchased and delivered to a group of teenage athletes, enabling them to continue their sports activities.

Program budget




Figure 1. Allocation of donations for food and clothing.

• In this phase, \$5000 donation was allocated, 80% of the donation was directed towards food baskets, ensuring families had access to nutritious meals. The remaining 20% was distributed for clothing assistance, providing sport clothes for a group of youth athletes (Figure 1).

Food basket donation

- In collaboration with local social workers, 300 families, identified for food assistance, received nutritional support. Each family received two baskets containing a diverse range of staple food items (Table 1).
- In addition to the food baskets limited number, 20 packages of milk were delivered to families with children.

Table 1. Items of each basket.

Food items	Amount
Rice	10 (Kg)
Cooking oil	2 (Bottle)
Lentil/Red Bean	1 (Kg)
Chickpea	1 (Kg)
Soybean	0.4 (Kg)
Pasta	2 (Package)
Tomato paste	2 (Can)




Figure 2. Distribution of 300 food basket across 4 regions in Khuzestan.

- All of the food items were distributed across four regions in Khuzestan (Figure 2).
- In collaboration with local agents and volunteers, a community event has been hosted to facilitate in the distribution process across different regions (Figures 3 and 4).

Clothing assistance

• To help young athletes continue their sport, 38 pairs of shoes (Figure 5) were provided for 38 children, and 30 athletic wear sets were purchased for 30 young men (Figure 6) living in Ahvaz.
