Food baskets for families
Sistan-Baluchestan

April 2024



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Summary

The Niiky Foundation continued its mission to combat hunger in Iran by delivering another round of food baskets in Sistan-Baluchestan province in April 2024. This impoverished region, plagued by economic hardship and food insecurity, has been a primary focus for the Foundation's humanitarian efforts.



300 essential food baskets were distributed among families in need across Iranshahr, Sarbaz, and Zahedan, where are known for their severe poverty and limited access to necessities.

Program budget

In this phase, a \$10,000 (593,290,000 Toman) donation was fully allocated to providing food baskets, ensuring that families had access to nutritious meals. Of this amount, approximately \$41.35 (2,450,000 Toman) was allocated for the delivery of the food, while the remainder was spent on pantry items and meat (590,840,000 Toman).

Food basket donation

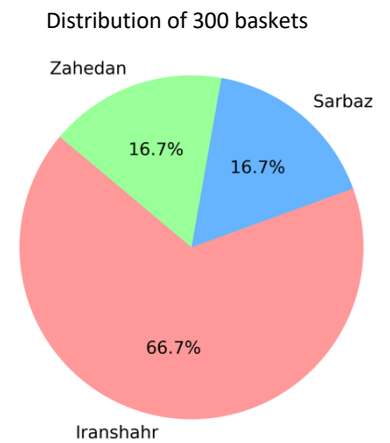
In collaboration with local social workers, 300 families identified as needing food assistance received nutritional support. Each family was given a basket containing a variety of staple food items, designed to meet their needs for approximately one month (Table 1). The cost of each food basket was about \$33.2 (1,966,400 Toman).

Food baskets were distributed across three cities in Sistan-Baluchestan, as illustrated in the pie chart: 200 baskets were allocated to Iranshahr, 50 to Zahedan, and 50 to Sarbaz.
